

Juniors.

- a. The junior science fair will be similar to the seniors. They can have a poster or several posters, but the size must not exceed **100cm by 80cm**. The language used on the poster should be one of the three working languages of the European Schools.
- b. In addition, juniors are allowed to bring apparatus etc. to demonstrate their project. They will be given a table for the apparatus (the size depends upon the venue) and a stand for their poster. Juniors are therefore the only group who can bring their project equipment to the symposium.
- c. In addition, pupils can bring a handout to be given to anyone who visits their project.
- d. Judging will be carried out by a jury and pupils will be expected to explain their project to visitors at their stand. They will be expected to be able to discuss their project with the judges, fellow pupils and teachers. All members of the group should be able to contribute equally to a discussion or explanation.
- e. The language used for the questions and answers should be one of the three working languages of the European Schools. However, for the juniors we are happy for them to explain their work in a language that is mutually convenient for the presenter and questioner.

General Guidelines.

1. All projects in all sections have to be based on **practical work carried out by the pupils**.
2. Outside assistance is perfectly acceptable, but it must be acknowledged.
3. **Deadlines must be kept to if projects are to be accepted.**
4. **Projects may be disqualified by the jury if the above rules are not followed.**
5. The decision of the jury members is final.
